Food for the Flock

He is Risen Alleluia! I'm writing this Tuesday afternoon—when you read it, I will have baptized, confirmed and shared the Eucharist with a large group of all ages from both parishes, and our Lord will have renewed the new and everlasting covenant he made for us with his broken body and shed blood. Although tiring, Father Tom, Father Ang and I look forward to the holy Three Days (Holy Thursday-to-Easter Vigil) that are the center of our Faith; it is a tremendous privilege to share them with you.

After 40 days of penance, we have 50 days of feasting: Easter ends with Pentecost.

St. Boniface Texas Hold 'Em. I meant to report sooner on this first-ever event. Winners: three tied for first: Ed Piongios, Tom Tyler and Tim Lee; fourth: Ted Roller; fifth: Mike Evans; sixth: David Martin. A total of \$1,548 (plus some change) was awarded in prizes, and St. Boniface netted \$1,577. Brad Fortman did a great job, well organized. Turnout was lower than hoped, but we had competition, and we know how to avoid that next time. Players want to come back, and we believe attendance will grow.

Rebuild St. Boniface Drive. I'm encouraged by, and grateful for, the responses received so far from my recent letter. With your generosity, we have begun making repairs to the window sills that leak so badly. The vestibule has been repaired and freshly painted, but we're not finished. After Easter, we will be adding some color back, but Mark Pitsenbarger and I want to make a good decision.

Gates installed in old alley near St. Mary. When we demolished the house on the corner of St. Mary's property, I conferred with our neighbors. They were agreeable, but did suggest we close the alley that went between their house and the house we tore down. The neighbors didn't like having traffic down that alley and I don't blame them; no one would. So I was happy to cooperate with the neighbor in this regard. They also wanted gates, and paid the entire cost; again, I agreed. We want to be good neighbors.

Celebrating Divine Mercy at St. Mary next Sunday. As in the past, at 3 pm at St. Mary, we'll have a period of exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, and after some silent adoration, we'll pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet and complete the novena begun on Good Friday. Transfiguration and St. Peter (Huber Heights) parishes are having big celebrations—so I've done this more low-key so as not to take anything away from them.
