We enjoyed a hot meal from Javawocky, and bid on great items given by parishioners and area businesses. The organizers and I believe this is worth doing again. Rebuild St. Boniface Fund tops \$150,000. We are almost a third of the way to our goal!

Thanks musicians, led by John Wright, for a *great concert* last Sunday: raising over \$600 for Missions.

Parish finances, first 3 quarters: I recently presented information on the third quarter of the fiscal year to each finance council, the overall picture is as follows:

St. Mary: giving is up, especially special gifts, thank you! The past 2 months, however, weekly collections have been short of budget, putting us in the red so far. If collections pick up, and we have a good festival, we can still end in the black two years in a row. Some current-year tuition is outstanding.

On the spending side, most categories are on target; we did have some maintenance and repair costs that were unexpected (as they usually are). We had more St. Mary children enrolled in Piqua Catholic than expected, so we owed more for annual subsidy than planned for.

St. Boniface: you have been generous with collections and the Rebuild St. Boniface drive, and many good events, including last summer's festival. Bingo revenue is up, but not enough—this is our one weak spot, so we face a deficit; also some tuition is past-due.

On the spending side, more is going for maintenance and repairs—I had to estimate last summer how much we'd spend, and I guessed too low. We're being conservative with everything else, but most costs are fixed—heat, school subsidy, payroll, benefits, taxes—very little we can do.
